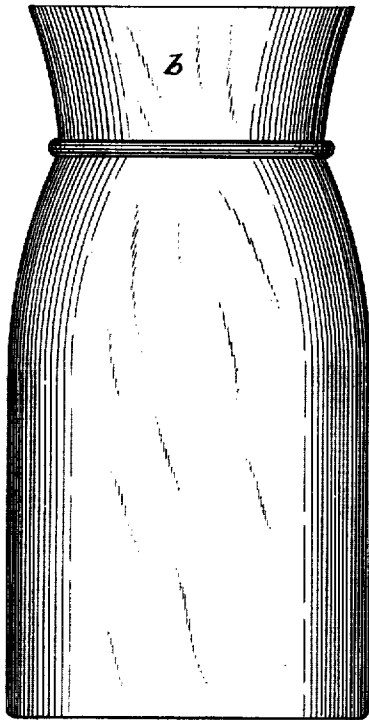
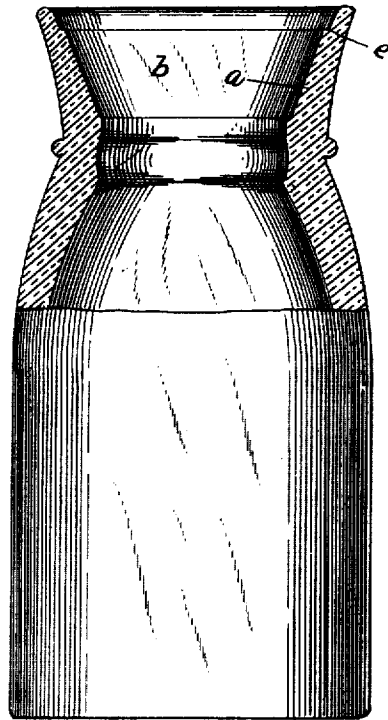

MARTIN E. GRIFFITH, OF MANOR STATION, PENNSYLVANIA.

DESIGN FOR A BOTTLE OR JAR.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 28,842, dated June 14, 1898.

Application filed August 26, 1897. Serial No. 649,645. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MARTIN E. GRIFFITH, a citizen of the United States of America, residing at Manor Station, in the county of Westmoreland and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and original Design for Bottles, Jars, and Similar Vessels, of which the following is a specification, reference being had therein to the accompanying

10 drawings.

This invention relates to a certain new and original design for bottles and jars.

The leading features of my design consist of a cylindrical body portion contracting near its upper end, and having a flaring mouth.

In describing the invention in detail reference is had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part of this specification and wherein like letters of reference indicate similar parts throughout the several views, in which—

20 Figure 1 is a side elevation of my design

for a jar. Fig. 2 is a similar view showing a portion of the neck broken away.

The body of the bottle or jar, which has the shape or configuration as shown, has a neck *b*, 25 which diverges from its base, forming the inclined face *a*. The inner face of the neck of the bottle or jar has a circumferential shoulder formed therein and extending from the upper edge of the inclined face to the top of the 30 neck.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a bottle or jar as herein shown and described. 35
